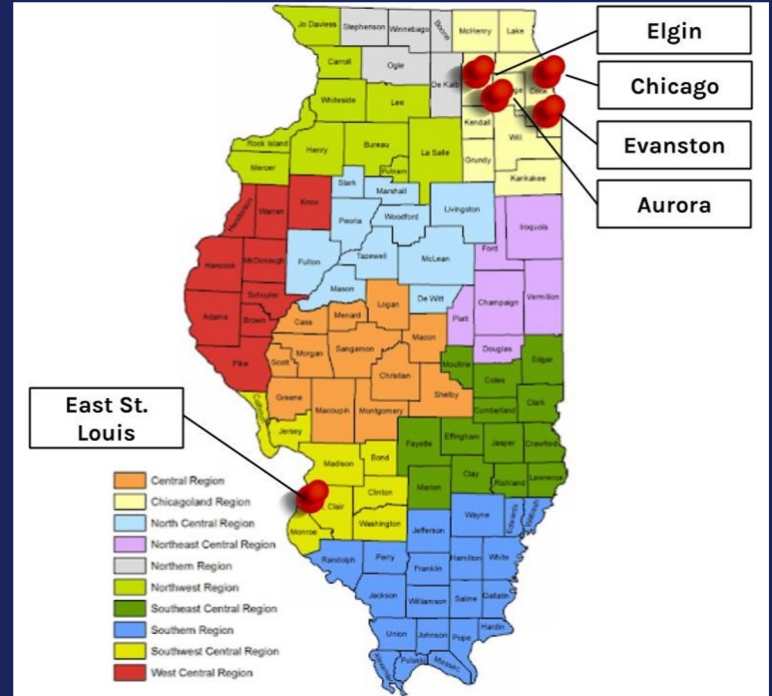

Why does Illinois offer a solar program like ILSFA?

- ILSFA was created when the Future Energy Jobs Act (FEJA) passed in 2016
- ILSFA focuses on income-eligible households with enhanced benefits and consumer protections. Households that do not qualify for ILSFA can participate in another solar incentive program, Illinois Shines



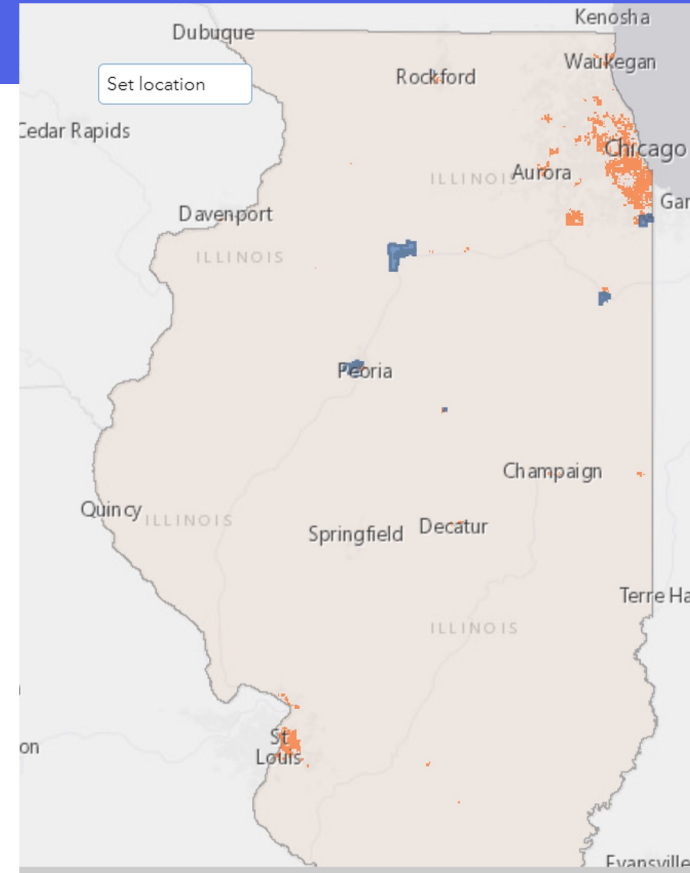
Why solar?

- Switching to solar energy protects the environment and creates jobs
- If you participate in solar through the Illinois Solar for All program, you are guaranteed to save on your electricity bills.



Environmental Justice Communities

- Overall, Black and brown communities have more than their fair share of pollution and industry in their backyards which affects our health.
- Our communities face a lot of other challenges, like lack of jobs, services, lack of investment in the community, etc.
- Illinois Solar for All gives special preference to residents of these areas



Why solar energy?

Stepping Out of Poverty Campaign

- POWER-PAC's 2018 report found that utility debt was one of the main causes of debt for low-income families
- As a result, the STOP campaign began to fight for more affordable utilities and protections for low income families.
- Solar energy through Illinois Solar for All is ONE way to save money on utilities

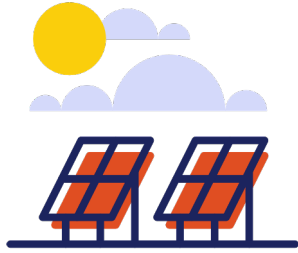


Three programs within Solar for All!

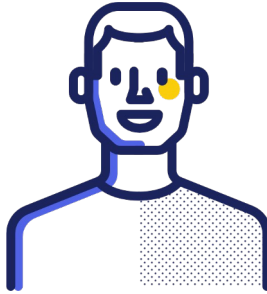
1. Rooftop solar for homeowners!
2. Non-profit solar for schools, religious buildings, non-profits, and government buildings!
3. Community Solar!



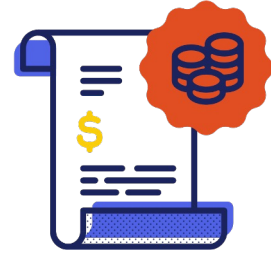
How does a community solar project work?



1. Solar panels are installed in a sunny location somewhere in the community



2. Anyone who is income qualified and has a ComEd bill can subscribe to the community solar project and start receiving solar energy for their home.



3. You will receive a discount on your ComEd bill for the electricity created by your share of the solar project

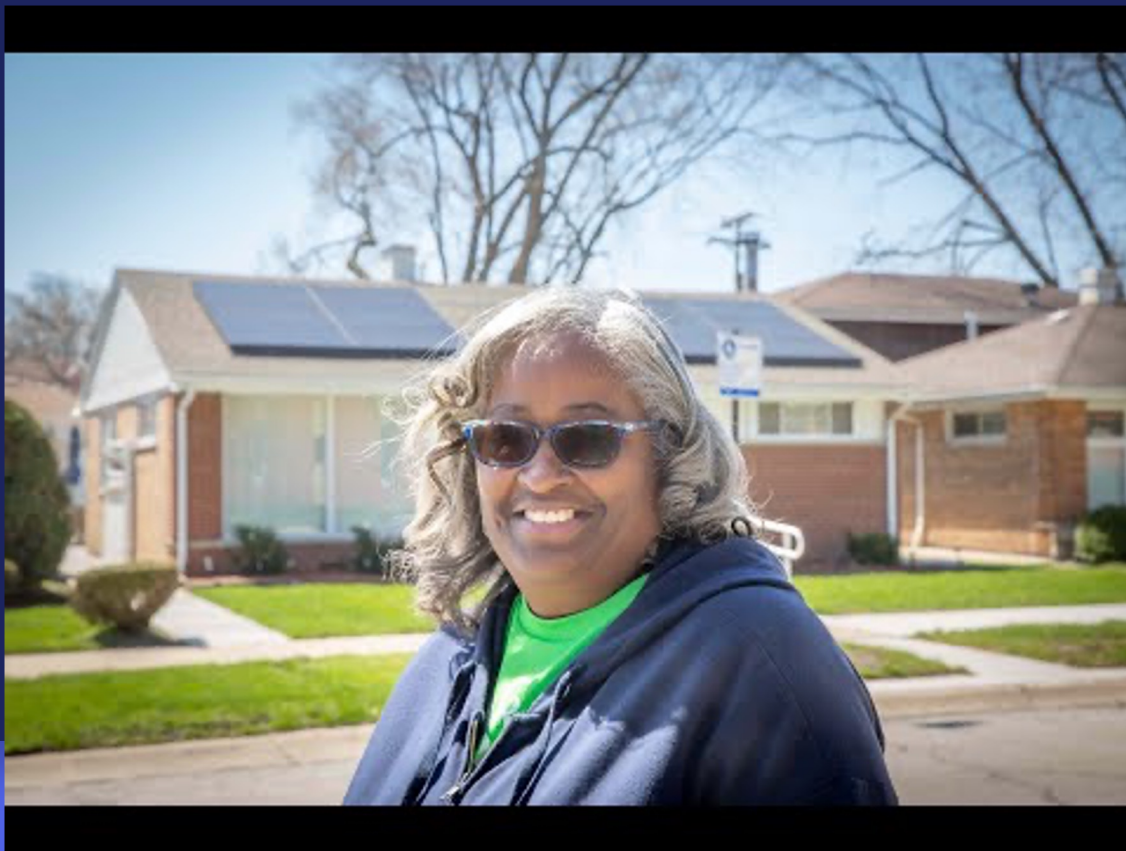


How do I qualify?

Income Qualifications:

- **\$0 - \$44,250 for 1 person**
- **\$0 - \$50,600 for a family of 2**
- **\$0 - \$56,900 for a family of 3**
- **\$0 - \$63,200 for a family of 4**
- **\$0 - \$68,300 for a family of 5**
- **\$0 - \$73,350 for a family of 6**
- **\$0 - \$78,400 for a family of 7**
