



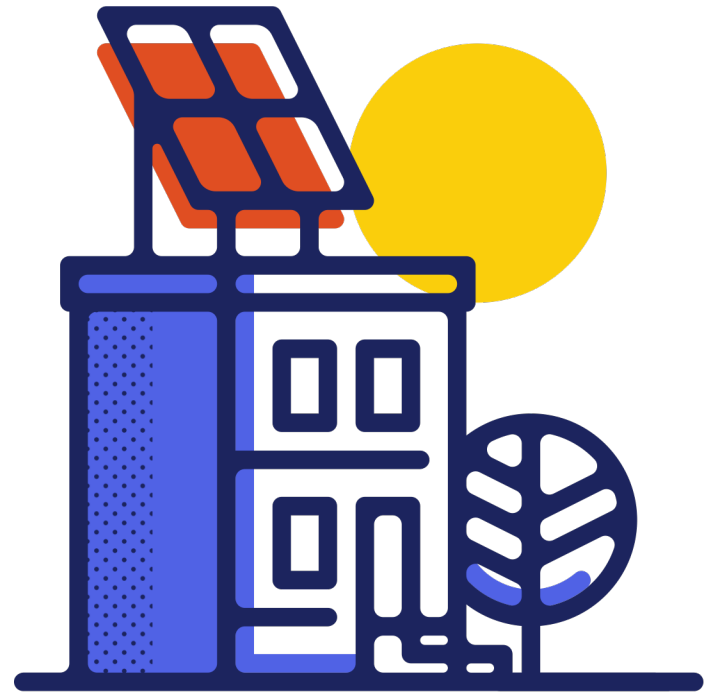

Illinois Solar for All (ILSFA) Overview

- Made possible by the Future Energy Jobs Act (FEJA) and the Climate and Equitable Jobs Act (CEJA)
- Provides incentives to help make solar installations in low-income and environmental justice communities more affordable
- Administered by Elevate Energy on behalf of the Illinois Power Agency (IPA)
- Illinois Shines- market rate

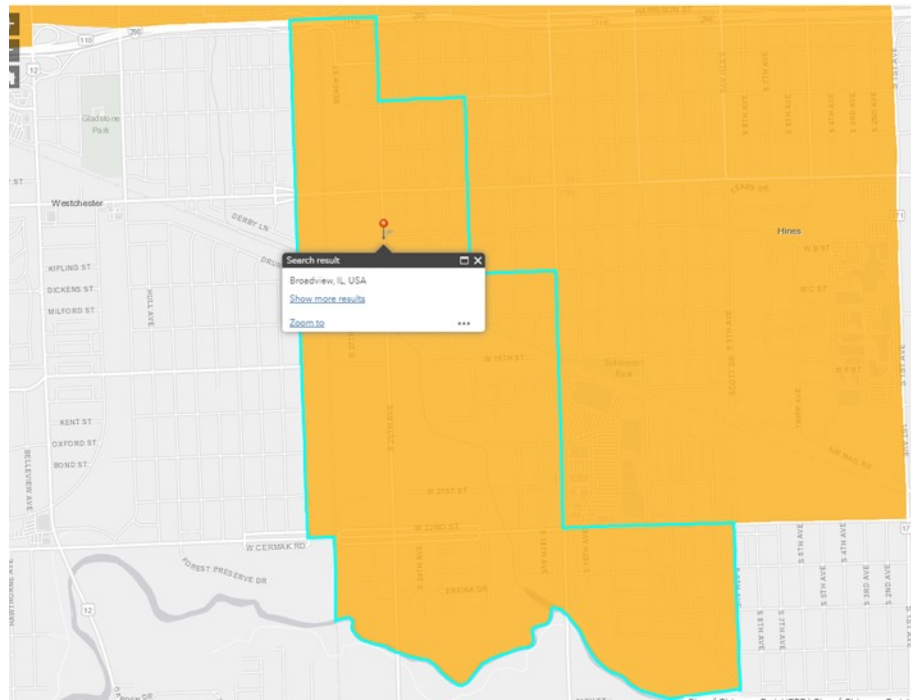


Who is Illinois Solar for All for?

- Institutions serving income eligible communities
 - Non-profits
 - Public facilities
- Income eligible residents (including renters!) and affordable housing owners

Non-profits and public facilities

- Non-profit organizations and public entities must be located in either an [Environmental Justice Community](#) and/or a low-income community



Non-profit and public facilities

- Site suitability
- Input and connection to low-income community
- Must be considered a “Critical Service Provider”
 - Fire stations
 - Municipal administration offices
 - Libraries
 - Homeless shelters
 - Hospitals, health care facilities, and clinics
 - Job training and workforce development services
 - Etc.



Savings

- No upfront costs allowed
- Savings required & realized through net metering

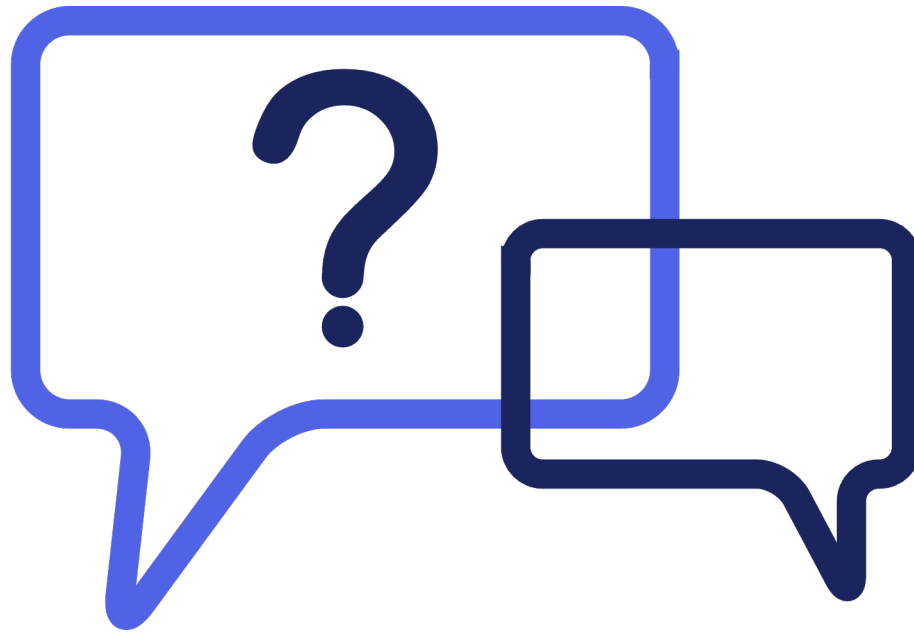
